 ADOPT THE GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORATION AND THE GEORGIA ASSOCIATION OF METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FY 2021 TRANSPORTATION PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT TARGETS

WHEREAS, the 49 CFR 625 requires public transportation providers to develop and implement out a transit asset management (TAM) plan to ensure that transit assets are kept in a state of good repair (SGR); and

WHEREAS, the 23 CFR 450.306(d)(4) states that "an MPO shall integrate in the metropolitan transportation planning process, directly or by reference, the goals, objectives, performance measures, and targets described in other state transportation plans and transportation processes, as well as any plans developed under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 by providers of public transportation, required as part of a performance-based program;" and

WHEREAS, the Technical Coordinating Committee (TCC) of the Hinesville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (HAMPO) in coordination with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), and the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) has reviewed the requirements to adopt Transit Asset Management Safety Performance Measures for use in HAMPO's transportation process; and

WHEREAS, the TCC at its November 12, 2020 meeting recommended that HAMPO support the Transit Asset Performance Targets approved by the Georgia Department of Transportation as follows:

• PM1t: Group Transit Asset Management Plan

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the HAMPO Policy Committee concurs with the recommendation of the HAMPO Technical Coordinating Committee to agree and support the Performance Management Targets as approved by the Georgia Department of Transportation.
