3. Approval of Minutes

• Paul Hawkins made the motion to approve the February 13, 2020 minutes, seconded by Allen Brown and all voted in favor.

4. Old Business

a) GDOT:

a. Design Stage:

- US 84 Freight Connector the R.O.W. has been pushed back to next year. They will begin to acquire R.O.W. within the next year and a half. Preliminary design and environmental work are ongoing. Supplemental preliminary plan review is scheduled for next month, on schedule to submit a draft environmental report this month. Four deeds have been acquired thus far.
- Flemington Curve Improvements let 2020-Final design is ongoing. Appraisals are being prepared for R.O.W. negotiation.
- Taylors Creek Bridge let January 2020- R.O.W. acquisition is ongoing, and they are wrapping up final design. Dealing with fiber cable on base. Final plans have been submitted.

b. Under Construction:

- I-95 Resurfacing still doing resurfacing work.
- 38 Connector resurfacing. Proposed to begin late April.
- Resurfacing on US 84 from O.C. Martin Drive to I-95 on schedule to let in March.

b) LOCAL:

a. Under Construction:

• S. Main Sidewalk – all sidewalks have been installed from Glenn Bryant Road to Airport Road. Project is 97% complete. In process of finishing Ralph Quarterman Drive. The T-SPLOST referendum has been postponed until May 19.

c) Liberty Transit:

• Ridership has been steady. Rachel stated that she spoke to Theodis and they are reformatting the transit reporting template. She expects this month's ridership to be lower due to COVID-19.

d) Transportation Comment Log:

- a. There was a previous complaint about lack of a pedestrian crosswalk across US 17 between the Midway Museum and the Historic Cemetery. Byron stated that GDOT stated that this crosswalk does not warrant the amount of pedestrian traffic needed. Byron suggested that Jeff send in a request on letterhead for this matter and to acquire updated pedestrian counts.
- b. County Commissioner Stevens asked that GDOT consider placing a "no turn on red' sign at the intersection of 196E and Hwy 84. GDOT has responded and determined that the intersection is conforming with the manual on uniform traffic devices.

5. New Business

a) 2018-2021 TIP Amendment # 5:

Rachel Hatcher with RS&H gave this presentation stating that GDOT is requesting an amendment to the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Plan and the MPO's LRTP/MTP. Asking for a new bridge project to be added located on CR 171/Lewis Frasier Road at Peacock Creek. Thirty-day public comment will be needed.

Gary Gilliard made a motion to release Draft 2018-2021 TIP Amendment # 5 for a 30-day public comment period. The motion was seconded by Paul Hawkins and all voted in favor.

- b) Draft FY 2021 UPWP: 30-day review: Rachel went over this with the committee.
 - Gary Gilliard made a motion to recommend that the Policy Committee release draft FY 2021 UPWP for a 30-day public comment period, seconded by Melissa Ray and all voted in favor.
- c) 2020-2045 MTP status update: Rachel gave a brief update of the study overview, project status and next steps. Rachel also went over the 2045 priority ranking for the MTP. Chairman Lovette asked for Jeff and Rachel to make the priority ranking list a public release and place in the newspaper.
- d) **FY 2020 UPWP Amendment #6:** Rachel explained the UPWP modification reflects administrative budgetary changes to support ongoing HAMPO activities. Funds have been reallocated, by phase and tasks, to sustain remaining HAMPO activities for FY 2020.

Dear Mr. Ricketson:

This letter is to advise that our office has reviewed your correspondence, dated February 12th, 2020, regarding the intersection of SR 38/US 84 (E. Oglethorpe Hwy) at SR 196 (Leroy Coffer Hwy) for the installation of a "No Turn On Red" sign.

A review of this intersection has determined that the existing signage and layout for the dual rights is in accordance with the MUTCD (Manual on Uniformed Traffic Control Devices) and Departmental Policies and Guidelines. A review of the crashes indicated there were twenty-three (23) reported crashes in 2019, of which, none were a result of a collision between a right turning vehicle on SR 196 and a westbound vehicle on SR 38. Majority of these crashes were rear ends and side swipes on SR 196. Also, restricting right turning traffic from SR 196 to SR 38 during a red traffic signal will reduce the level of service for that approach and cause major delays. For these reasons, we will maintain the current signal operation and traffic movements.

In an effort to improve driver visibility of the right turning vehicles and rear ends, our forces installed a "Right On Red After Stop" overhead sign this past January. We will continue to monitor this intersection to see if there are any changes to traffic patterns or increases to traffic volumes.


Study Overview

- Governs expenditures of federal and state highway dollars
