ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR APPLICANT

1. Fee - \$110 per disturbed acre for first 10 acres and \$25 for each acre over 10. Fee to be submitted with application.
2. The Land Disturbing Activity (LDA) permit will not be issued until LCPC has approved the erosion, sediment and pollution control (ES&PC) plans and, if required, the GSWCC has approved the plans, as well.
3. If GSWCC approval is required, the engineer is responsible for submitting the ES&PC plans and other supporting documentation to GSWCC directly. LCPC shall be provided copies of all correspondence.
4. The LDA permit will not be issued until the initial best management practices (BMPs) as shown on the approved ES&PC plans have been installed and certified by the engineer.
5. The permit, if issued, authorizes the work described in this application and is valid for one (1) year from the issuance date.
6. LCPC reserves the right to reevaluate the project with regard to compliance with the local erosion, sediment and pollution control ordinance.
7. Other permits - local, state and/or federal - may be required. While it is the applicant's responsibility to obtain such permits if required, LCPC may require other permits to be obtained prior to issuance of the LDA permit.
8. The granting of this permit does not presume to give authority to violate or supersede the provisions of any other state or local law regarding construction or the performance of construction.
