




b. Transit Updates

### a. Election of Officers – Action Item

### ARTICLE IV

### Officers and Organization

- The Policy Committee shall select a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson from among its members.
   Such selection shall be by majority of the voting membership.
- 2) In the absence of both the Chairperson and the Vice-Chairperson, the members present for the meeting shall designate, by majority vote, a member to temporarily assume the responsibilities of the Chairpersons for the purpose of conducting the official business of the Committee.
- 3) Selections shall take place at the first meeting of each calendar year at which there is a majority of voting members present. A nominating committee of three (3) will be appointed by the Policy Committee Chair for the specific purpose of the appointment of new officers. The nominating committee shall present a slate of officers to fill Policy Committee for selection. The selected officers will take office once selected.
- 4) The term of Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be for the calendar year.
- 5) Officers may succeed themselves with no limitation to the number of terms, except that such term will not continue in the event an officer becomes ineligible to be a member of the Policy Committee.
- 6) The Chairperson may at any time establish sub-committees of the Committee. Such sub-committees shall function in a manner similar to the full Committee and in accordance with these By-laws.

c. Calendar Year 2024 Safety Performance Measures – Action Item

GDOT's Safety Performance Targets are used to help improve data, foster transparency and accountability

Allow safety progress to be tracked at the national and state level

They measure if a state has met, or made significant progress, in meeting the performance targets

GDOT developed Recommended Performance Targets

- Uses unweighted rolling five-year average
- Available data sources include Fatality Analysis Reporting System (FARS) and Georgia Electronic Accident Reporting System (GEARS)







c. Calendar Year 2024 Safety Performance Measures – Action Item

### **Calendar Year 2024 Targets:**

- **Number of Fatalities 1,680.0** To maintain traffic fatalities under the projected 1,680 (2019-2023 rolling average) by 2024
- **Number of Serious Injuries 8,966.0** -To maintain the 5-year moving average serious traffic injuries under the projected 24,094 (2018-2022) 5-year average by 2024
- Fatality Rate 1.36 To maintain traffic fatalities per 100MVMT under the projected 1.36 (2019-2023 rolling average) by 2024
- **Serious Injury Rate 7.679** To maintain serious injuries in traffic crashes per 100MVMT under the projected 7.679 (2019-2023 rolling average) by 2024
- Total Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries 802.0 To maintain the number of non-motorist serious injuries and fatalities under the projected 802 (2019-2023 rolling average) by 2024

### d. Greenhouse Gas Final Rule – Informational Item

- On November 22, 2023 FHWA released its Greenhouse Gas Performance Measure final rule
- State DOTs and MPOs must measure and report GHG emissions associated with transportation
- Targets must be set for reducing CO<sub>2</sub> emissions
- State DOTs will be responsible for setting initial targets, due Feb.
   2024
  - MPOs have 180 days after state targets are set to adopt targets
  - Starting in 2026, 2-year and 4-year targets will be established
