



 - Draft scenarios and route recommendations developed






b. Transit Updates






The Safety Plan will be developed using inclusive and representative processes to pursue a comprehensive approach to advancing equity for all.

GDOT Carbon Reduction Strategy

- GDOT announced that FHWA has completed review of CRS
- FHWA certified that CRS meets statutory requirements
- Further information, including coordination with state MPOs, will be provided at a later date

GDQT Carbon Reduction Program

What is the Carbon Reduction Program?

The Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) is a federal program established under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) to reduce transportation emissions through the development of state carbon reduction strategies and by funding projects designed to reduce transportation emissions

Each State is eligible to receive federal funding under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) for projects designed to reduce transportation carbon emissions from on-highway sources.

GDOT is in the process of developing a carbon reduction strategy (CRS) document which identifies transportation strategies to reduce emissions that align with state priorities and comply with federal requirements.

What is the Carbon Reduction Strategy?

The CRS is a document that will guide GDOT and Georgia's Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) as they select strategies to include in their planning process and leverage available federal funds. The GDOT CRS includes a menu of strategies and projects which are eligible for CRP funds and are consistent with state priorities. The plan will be updated every 4 years after USDOT approval. The strategies/projects fall into 3 broad categories:



Sustainable Infrastructure This set of strategies addresses infrastructure-based

reductions, such as sustainable pavements, alternative construction, and maintenance practices.



Operational Efficiency Improvements Efforts to manage transportation operations, optimize

system performance, reduce delay, and smooth traffic flow to reduce vehicle exhaust.



Alternative Technologies and Modes Strategies addressing

consumer choice, including choices related to vehicle purchases and travel choices.

- HAMPO has performed two administrative modifications to the FY 24 – 27 TIP
- Admin Mod #2 incorporated the 2024 Safety Performance Measures into the TIP and Safety Performance Report
- Admin Mod #3 updated the CST phase cost for PI 522570 SR 38
 Bypass from SR 38 to SR 119 (Hinesville Bypass/Freight Connector)
 - Total CST cost increased by \$3,774,320.55



II. This area includes the cities of Allenhurst, Flemington, Gum Branch, Hinesville, Midway, Riceboro and Walthourville, all of Liberty County and portions of the unincorporated area of Long County that are adjacent to these cities as well as the cantonment area of Fort Stewart.
