


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b. Transit Updates

Paratransit Ridership April 2022 - March 2023 April 2023 - March 2024

- Paratransit ridership is lower than previous year for March
- March 2024 system-wide ridership grew by 5.6% over March 2023 ridership,
 - Route 3 grew by 142% (59 rides to 143 rides)

GDOT Carbon Reduction Strategy

- FHWA certified that GDOT's CRS meets statutory requirements
- Further information, including coordination with MPOs, will be provided at a later date



What is the Carbon Reduction Program?

The Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) is a federal program established under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) to reduce transportation emissions through the development of state carbon reduction strategies and by funding projects designed to reduce transportation emissions

Each State is eligible to receive federal funding under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) for projects designed to reduce transportation carbon emissions from on-highway sources.





GDOT is in the process of developing a carbon reduction strategy (CRS) document which identifies transportation strategies to reduce emissions that align with state priorities and comply with federal requirements.

What is the Carbon Reduction Strategy?

The CRS is a document that will guide GDOT and Georgia's Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) as they select strategies to include in their planning process and leverage available federal funds. The GDOT CRS includes a menu of strategies and projects which are eligible for CRP funds and are consistent with state priorities. The plan will be updated every 4 years after USDOT approval. The strategies/projects fall into 3 broad categories:

HAMPO FY 2024 – 27 TIP Admin Modification #3, #4

- HAMPO has performed two administrative modifications to the FY 24 27 TIP
- Admin Mod #2 incorporated the 2024 Safety Performance Measures into the TIP and Safety Performance Report
- Admin Mod #3 updated the CST phase cost for PI 522570 SR 38 Bypass from SR 38 to SR 119 (Hinesville Bypass/Freight Connector)
 - Total CST cost increased by \$3,774,320.55

d. HAMPO Administrative Updates

GHG Final Rule

- FHWA informed Georgia MPOs that 22 states filed lawsuits challenging GHG Final Rule
- On March 27, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas vacated and remanded the Final Rule to DOT, in effect nullifying the rule nationwide.
- States and MPOs are not required to submit initial targets and reports
- When new information becomes available, it will be brought forward to this committee

 - PI 0017411 I-95 from Florida State Line to South Carolina State Line
- Total CST cost (fed and state) for funding code Y001 increased by \$13,588,829.88

- The MTP document is being updated to stay fiscally constrained and consistent with the current TIP document
- Projects will be moved to different bands to ensure the document is fiscally constrained








d. Updated MPA Adoption – Action Item

- Urbanized Area (UZA): US Census defined area with 50,000+ pop
- Urban Area Boundary (UAB): Corrected boundary prepared by MPO & GDOT to refine the UZA.
- Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA): Adjusted planning area encompassing areas anticipated to become urban within 20 years.









d. Updated MPA Adoption – Action Item

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) identifies the areas that are the responsibility of the MPO

II. IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that the areas of responsibility of the aforementioned counties, municipalities, and government agencies shall lay within the study area Boundary established by the Policy Committee of the HAMPO Regional Transportation Study. This area includes the cities of Allenhurst, Flemington, Gum Branch, Hinesville, Midway, Riceboro and Walthourville, all of Liberty County and portions of the unincorporated area of Long County that are adjacent to these cities as well as the cantonment area of Fort Stewart.
